²⁷ And beginning at Moses and all the prophets, he expounded unto them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself.

Objective of Lesson:

Every book of the Bible is about the person and work of our Lord Jesus Christ. That is the only message of scripture.

Lesson Instructions:

1. Today we are going to talk about this Book? (Hold up the Bible)
2. Can anybody tell me what this book is called? It is called a Bible.
3. Can anybody tell me what this book is about? This is a very big question. It is also a very important question. That is what we are going to learn about today.
4. Each one of you has seen this book. Your parents all have one, and some of you may have your own copy. Every time you come to this class I want you to bring this book. This is the only book we will ever study, because there is no other book written that tells you anything as important as what this one tells you.
5. Every week, when you come to church you see this book. Everybody that comes to church has one. Your pastor stands up front and teaches from this book, and everybody listening follows along in this book. Everything we do here at church surrounds learning about what this book says; so what this book says must be pretty important.
6. The first thing I want you to learn is who wrote the Book. Do you know who wrote this Book? God did. How do we know God wrote it? Did God get a piece of paper and a pencil and write down all these words we see here? No. How did God do it? God used a number of different men, whom he chose, over a span of many, many years to write each one of the books of the Bible. These men wrote down what God told them to write. How do we know this? There is a scripture in this book that tells us this.
7. I want you each to open your Bibles to the following verse. (Help them find the verse) II Peter 1:21 - "For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost." The Bible tells us here just how these words came to be written: "by holy men of God"... "as they were moved by the Holy Ghost".
8. Each one of these books was written by a different man, at different times. Most of these men did not even know each other, but there is one AMAZING fact. Because they were all chosen of God and inspired by the Holy Spirit of God to write, they ALL wrote about the same message. Only God can make that happen.
9. The second thing I want you to learn is this: What is the message of this book? I just told you the whole book has one theme. What is a theme? A theme means each book talks about the same thing.

10. What is that one theme? The Bible answers this question for us too. I want you to turn to the following verse - Heb. 10:7, "Then said I, Lo, I come (in the volume of the book it is written of me,) to do thy will, O God." In this verse our Lord Jesus Christ is talking to God His Father, and His words are recorded here by the inspiration of God, to tell us plainly what this book is about. It is about HIM. This whole book, from front to back is all about Jesus Christ, and how he saved his people from their sins. Every single story I tell you from this book is only about one person, and what He did. He is Jesus Christ the Son of God, and He sacrificed Himself to pay for the sins of His people.
11. The third thing I want you to learn is this: Why did God give us this book? Where do you think we can find the answer to this question? The Bible answers this question for us too. I want you to turn to the following verse - John 20:31, "But these are written, that ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through his name."
12. Every week, when we meet, I am going to teach you a story, a poem, or a song from this book. Each story, or poem, or song teaches about God's Son, Jesus Christ, and how he saved his people from their sins. I am only going to talk about this one person and this one theme, because that is all this book teaches. Here in this book we are taught in as plain, as words can make it, that the whole body of Scripture is concerning the Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ taught the same thing in Luke 24:27 to His disciples - "Beginning at Moses and all the prophets, he expounded unto them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself."
13. The story of Moses and the tabernacle in the wilderness, the story of Noah's Ark, the story of the Tower of Babel, and all the stories, songs, and poems you have been learning each week are all pictures of Jesus Christ, and how He saves His people from their sins!
14. Do you know what a cradle is? A cradle is a baby bed. Can anybody use a cradle? No, only babies are found in a cradle. Just like only babies are found in a cradle, only Christ is found in this book. If you are looking for a baby, you go look in a cradle. If you are looking for Christ, you go look in this Book. (Martin Luther)... "There is not a word in the Bible which can be understood without reference to the cross. As we go to the cradle in order to find the baby, so we go to the Scriptures only to find Christ."
15. Why do we come together to study this Book? Where we can find the answer to this question? In the Bible! This book is the only place where you can learn about Christ, the Savior of sinners. God promised us, when we meet together to worship and learn of Him, He will meet with us. Matthew 18:20, "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them."




